Instructions for completing the enrolment form

Enrolment at a general secondary school in the state of Brandenburg for the 2024/2025 school year

Dear parents and guardians,

This enrolment form for pupils entering form 7 asks you to state your preferred choices of schools and provides the relevant data as the basis for each stage in the procedure for transitioning into form 7.

You will receive comprehensive advice from your primary school, and you can also find basic and additional information about the Ü7 admissions procedure on the MBJS website. (https://mbjs.brandenburg.de) (in German only).

To enrol in a school from <u>12 February to 14 February 2024</u>, please hand the completed enrolment form to the form 6 class teacher at the primary school your child is currently attending.

If you choose an <u>independent school</u> for your child, enrol directly at this school and hand in the documents required (copies) for enrolment. At the same time, please complete the information on page (3) of the enrolment form.

You can also complete the enrolment form online. The parents can receive information and a login from the primary schools.

Point (4)	Initially, you choose <u>only one</u> course of education (BG). If possible, the desired course of education should be consistent with the educational recommendation made by the primary school (according to the expert report of the primary school).		
Point (5)	You should name a first choice and a second choice school (only public schools) that offer the course of education (BG) you want. In the choice of schools, you should consider the school leaving certificate you want your child to attain and which courses of education are offered at the schools you prefer.

	Trial lessons	If you choose a grammar school as your first and/or second choice, your child must have the necessary aptitude. If this is not the case, your child will be invited to take a qualifying exam in the form of one-day trial classes (PU). In the event the trial class exam is not passed, the enrolment documents will be forwarded, if applicable, to the school of second choice. If this school should also be a grammar school, enrolment will be referred	

		to a further school, as the qualification for attending grammar school is not given.	
Point (6)	Independent school	Please fill in the points on page 3 of the enrolment form. If you choose an independent school, you will enter into a <u>civil law contract</u> with an independent school provider. If your child is continuing their education at an independent school, please list that school on page 3 as well. If you choose an independent school, you do not necessarily need to name a first and second choice public school. If enrolment at an independent school is not effected, the competent public school board will assign your child to a public school.	
Point (7)	Upper secondary and comprehensive schools offer an elective subject (WP subject) from form 7 onwards. You can decide whether your child should take the WP subject¹ Business-Work-Technology (W-A-T) or Natural Sciences or a second foreign language. In addition, upper secondary schools and comprehensive schools also offer other WP subjects. In return, if the second foreign language is learned continuously in forms 7-10, this requirement will not apply in upper school of grammar school. Attendance of upper school of grammar school is also possible if the second foreign language is started only in 9th or 11th form. In that case, the second foreign language will be a required subject until the end of the upper school of grammar school. Grammar schools do not offer elective lessons in form 7. The second foreign language is a mandatory subject there.		
Point (8)	Native-language teaching is available to all pupils whose native tongue or the official language of their country of origin is not German. These voluntary extra lessons support comprehensive and integrated language development with a view to successful social and academic integration. Lessons are facilitated for groups of at least 12 pupils with the same native language. A maximum of four lessons per week are offered in addition to regular classes at selected school locations. A bilingual certificate of attendance (German and native language) is issued at the end of the school year. You can therefore indicate here if you wish your child to attend native-language classes.

 inclinations cannot be expected at another school,
- 2. after examining the individual case, it is found that the pupil's place of residence or usual place of abode is in the area of the school authority responsible for the desired school or that the pupil will move to the area of the school authority responsible for the school before the start of the new school year.
- 3. if a sibling is already attending the school and it is determined on a case-bycase basis that attendance at another school is unreasonable.
